1. **Registration** Entry Forms for this division can be found in the back of the Premium Fair Book, also at www.mcfairgrounds.org. and are due in the Fairgrounds office August 15, 2007.

Late Entry Forms will NOT be Accepted.

2. **Premiums checks will be mailed to exhibitors.**
3. ONLY items listed in this Division of Premium Fair Book will be accepted by these department Superintendents, as list in their respective class and lots superintendents have sole discretion.
4. All entry forms should indicate: Adult, Junior, Child, Challenged or Professional. Each will have their exhibits judged by age divisions.
5. All entries must have been made or finished since last year's Fair Superintendents have right of determination
6. All entries must be the sole work of the entrant, except for photography print processing.
7. Due to lack of space in the exhibit hall, be sure to check each department for limitations on the number of entries each exhibitor may have. ONE item per lot is a general rule.
8. For display purposes all pictures and photos MUST be mounted on poster board or construction paper, with a minimum 1" border all around to be acceptable (Exception Are: Fine Arts and Photography Professionals are to be in frames.) The border allows us to staple the exhibit up for display, without harming the exhibits. Exhibits NOT PROPERLY mounted, will NOT be judged.
9. No name on the front of any art work. Either the exhibitor or the superintendent must be sure it is covered before judging.
10. **Exhibits are to remain in place until September 17th. The Fair Committee reserves the right to withhold any Premium money if exhibit is removed early.**
Authorized removal of Exhibits is,
September 16th from 4:00pm to 8:00pm
September 17th from 4:00pm to 8:00 pm..
(If the exhibits are NOT removed, or claimed within 30 days the Director may dispose of the exhibits in whatever manner she or he may choose, with the exception of perishable items, those will be disposed of within 4 days after Fair.
11. **AMATEUR:** One who produces food, art, needlecraft or any type of craft for enjoyment without profit.
12. **PROFESSIONAL:** One who produces food, art, needlecraft, photography or any type of craft for profit, such as teaching full or part time. Selling of such items on a regular basis or uses such items in a small business as defined by the IRS. Pro's may NOT enter the class: My First Project.

13. ALL Exhibitors are responsible for transporting their exhibits to and from check-in area. No 'Dollies,' or carts are available.
14. No exhibitors are allowed in the exhibit halls while the exhibits are being judged

JUDGING CRITERIA

Includes General Regulations and Dept. Special Rules:

- A. No Superintendent may be a judge in their department, or any department where they have relatives or children entered.
- B. We judge by the AMERICAN STANDARD Method: the judging process is to rank exhibits against one another and award one first place, one second place, one third place. Judges MUST NOT award prizes to an unworthy exhibit. If no exhibit is worthy of a 1st place then there is to be no awards for that lot. When only one item is in a lot, judges will use the judging criteria list in that department to determine worthiness.
- C. Ribbon Placing for **Premium awards** for Tiny Tots, Children, Juniors, Adults, Challenged, Amateur and Professionals:
 - 1st = Blue Ribbon = \$4.00
 - 2nd = Red Ribbon = \$3.00
 - 3rd = White Ribbon = \$2.00

ONLY ONE RIBBON PER LOT
- D. A Purple Ribbon will be awarded for items that show merit for Honorable Mention, and will be given in all age groups. NO PREMIUM is paid, **ONLY ONE RIBBON PER CLASS**
- E. Honorable Mention, especially for children, age 11 and under, awarded **ONLY** if that lot has an exceptional amount of entries:
 - 4th = Pink = no premium
 - 5th = Yellow = no premium
 - 6th = Green = no premium

ONLY ONE RIBBON PER LOT
- F. All 1st place winners of each lot in a class will be judged for: Best of Class=Yellow Buttoned Ribbon w/\$3 additional Premium. **ONLY ONE WINNER PER CLASS**
- G. All Best of Class winners in each Dept. will be judged for: BEST OF SHOW, Green Buttoned Ribbon w/\$5 additional premium, **ONLY ONE WINNER PER DEPARTMENT** (those departments with multi age divisions will have one per age division)
- H. All children (ages 1 to 11) entering exhibits will at least be given a participation ribbon, which does not receive a premium.
